### **Student Dress Code:**

In accordance with professional workplace expectations, offensive tattoos will need to be covered with either a sleeve, band aid, or bandage material so they are not visible in the classroom, lab, clinical setting, or any other function organized by Valley College. Faculty reserve the right to determine the appropriateness of any tattoo. If an externship or clinical site requires that tattoos be covered, the student must comply.

SHOES: Faculty members may provide more specific standards for shoes. Medical Clinical Assistant should wear either black or white leather covered shoes (nursing shoes) or solid "Croc" style shoes (no holes). Shoes must be closed-heeled and closed-toed. Veterinary programs (Cleveland), shoes must be solid style shoes (no holes). )

Nursing ADN students (Martinsburg/Beckley) Shoes should be either black, gray, brown, blue, or white leather covered shoes (nursing shoes) or solid "croc" style shoes with no holes. Shoes must be waterproof and must be closed heal and closed toed. Practical Nursing (Cleveland/Fairlawn) students please refer to the appropriate program handbook.
